Veteran, Vintage and Classic & Historic Vehicles – On the initial issue of a club permit, veteran, vintage and classic and historic vehicles require one of the following:

- Current Certificate of Roadworthiness (RWC) issued in Victoria; or
 Official letter from your club/association confirming vehicle safety.

Street Rod Vehicles – On the initial issue of a club permit, street rod vehicles require one of the following:

- A VicRoads authorised street rod inspection report; or
 A VicRoads Vehicle Assessment Signatory Scheme approval certificate.

Personal information we collect from you in connection with the registration of your vehicle/vessel or administration of licence will be used for that purpose and may be used for other purposes permitted by the Road Safety Act 1986 and/or Marine Act 1988 and Regulations. Your personal information may be disclosed to contractors and agents of VicRoads, law enforcement agencies, other road and marine authorities, the Transport Accident Commission, vehicle manufacturers (for safety recalls only) courts and other organisations authorised to collect it. You are required to provide this information by the Road Safety Act 1986 and Regulations and/or Marine Act 1988. Failure to provide the information may result in your application not being processed or records not being properly maintained. Conditions of Permit Issue

A club permit can only be issued to vehicles in one of the following categories:

- **Veteran** – manufactured before 1 January 1919; or
- **Vintage** – manufactured after 31 December 1918 and before 1 January 1931; or
- **Classic and historic** – manufactured after 31 December 1930, but more than 25 years before the date of the application for a club permit; or
- **Street rod** – manufactured more than 25 years before the date of application for a club permit and modified in excess of the guidelines contained within the Vehicle Standards Information No. 8 (VS18), *Guide to Modifications for Motor Vehicles*; or
- A replica of a vehicle described above.

This permit is issued to allow the use of the vehicle for club activities, or for the purpose of repairing or servicing the vehicle in connection with club activities.

This permit is not transferable and does not allow an unroadworthy vehicle to be used on a road.
